

FCDC Latino Caucus General Meeting Thursday, April 25, 2024 @ 7 PM – 8:00 PM

Call to Order – The meeting was called to order by Maritza Zermeño at 7:03 PM • Procedures Used – Maritza Zermeño explained that since the reorganization the procedures for this meeting are to approve the agenda and continue with the points in it.

Approval of Agenda – Maritza moved to approve the agenda, Marta Calderon second the motion. Approved by unanimous consent.

• Maritza, as chair, proposed to appoint a secretary to take minutes of the meetings. Hearing no objections to the proposal, Maritza appointed Marta Calderon to take the minutes.

• Maritza informed the monthly meetings will be the last Thursdays of the month.

• Maritza read the Latino Caucus Mission Statement approved in the previous year and moved to reaffirm it again. Marta Calderon and Leonel Rojas seconded the motion. Hearing no objections, the Mission Statement was adapted by unanimous consent. Statement attached.

Welcome and **Introductions –** The following attendees introduced themselves and expressed their interests: Marta Calderon and Leonel Rojas, Franconia District Latino Outreach Liaisons; Todd Thurwachter interested in participation of all NOVA minorities in Democratic activities, erosion of the Latino support of the Dem party, misinformation of voters; Bob Fasick attempted to talk but had problems with the mic; Jose Peralta interested in increasing the presence of Latinos in events in the county; Federico Cura interested in democrats messaging and communications.

Featured Speaker: Elizabeth Guzman, Candidate for Member of Congress (VA 7) Past Virginia State

Delegate (31st District) introduced herself and her political successes in the past. She requested the support of the Latino Caucus in her election.

Comments by visiting officials, candidates and invited guests: Maritza introduced and gave the floor to Chris Falcon, first Latino Clerk of the Fairfax Circuit Court.

Chris introduced himself, the responsibilities of his office, and announced the following new services coming within this year:

• Satellite services in Reston at Cathy Hudgins Community Center: one morning a month, a mobile office will provide court services there. This service is likely to be expanded to other places in the county.

- A new free online information on criminal and civil cases service to be announced soon.
- Language access: continued effort to hire staff with multiple language skills.

New Business: Maritza will pass more information, at a later time, about how to contribute to the basket for the auction of the Fairfax Country fundraising event, the Blue Fairfax Dinner on June 2nd, 2024.

Jose Peralta raised the importance that Latinos have a representation in the events like CULMORE COMMUNITY DAY: Saturday, May 4, 2024, to communicate to the Latino community what the elected democratic Latinos are doing. Maritza explained that the Caucus has tables, tents, banners, and other material needed for participation in events. Jose will send Maritza a list of events where the Caucus can participate in the incoming months.

Leonel Rojas raised his concerns about the need to adjust and rethink the message to the Latinos. Todd Thurwachter expanded on the need to communicate the successful Bidden Administration programs that prevented a collapse of the country after COVID. Federico Cura added the need to reframe the messages using the Party moral values such as freedom and prosperity for all. He offered to make a presentation on the basics of messaging to the Latino Caucus.
